## **Crime Analysis**

A set of systematic, analytical processes directed at providing timely and pertinent information relative to crime patterns and trend correlations to assist the operational and administrative personnel in planning the deployment of resources for the prevention and suppression of criminal activities, aiding the investigative process, and increasing apprehensions and the clearance of cases. Within this context, Crime Analysis supports a number of department functions including patrol deployment, special operations, and tactical units, investigations, planning and research, crime prevention, and administrative services (budgeting and program planning). --Steven Gottlieb et al., 1994, "Crime Analysis: From First Report To Final Arrest."

During the month of April 2008. The Guilford Police Department had the following **Part** 1 and selected **Part 2** Crimes reported: Reference Appendix A for further information.

#### **Burglary Cases**

There were three (3) residential burglaries reported during this period. In one case a suspect was arrested. This suspect was also responsible for several thefts from auto cases in the sector 6 area of town. Further information on the theft from auto cases can be found in the larceny section of this report. In the two other burglary complaints received, no distinct patterns or modes operandi were found. *Reference Appendix B for a graph representation*.

#### Criminal Mischief Cases:

Sixteen (15) criminal mischief cases were filed; Eleven were private property damage, three were public property, and one was mailbox damage. No similarities in cases were found. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. Two cases were solved, with one resulting in an arrest. *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation*.

#### Larceny Cases:


Twenty-seven (27) larceny complaints were filed. A detailed examination of these cases revealed the following details: Of the twenty-seven cases, a total of eight larceny cases were solved with seven resulting in arrests. Five (5) of the cases were thefts from autos. Two were employee thefts from businesses, and one case was cleared through re-

payment prior to arrest. In the remaining cases no distinct patterns or modes operandi was found. <i>Reference Appendix D for a graph representation</i> .


CTIC provided LEO during this month. Guilford Police provided information to surrounding towns on the theft from auto cases that had been solved during this reporting period.


