Crime Analysis

A set of systematic, analytical processes directed at providing timely and pertinent information relative to crime patterns and trend correlations to assist the operational and administrative personnel in planning the deployment of resources for the prevention and suppression of criminal activities, aiding the investigative process, and increasing apprehensions and the clearance of cases. Within this context, Crime Analysis supports a number of department functions including patrol deployment, special operations, and tactical units, investigations, planning and research, crime prevention, and administrative services (budgeting and program planning). --Steven Gottlieb et al., 1994, "Crime Analysis: From First Report To Final Arrest."

SUBJECT: Crime Analysis Report January 2008

During the month of January 2008. The Guilford Police Department had the following **Part 1** and selected **Part 2** Crimes reported: Reference Appendix A for further information.

Burglary Cases

Six (6) residential burglaries were reported. An examination of these incidents revealed the following details; A total of three (3) were forced entry thru a door or window. One (1) of the burglaries reported during this period was in the northern sectors of the town. In all but one burglary jewelry and coins was the main item stolen. A total of (4) cases were solved A significant modes operandi (M.O.), as well as a suspect vehicle and persons information was developed in three (3) of the solved cases.

In addition the three (3) M.O. cases were solved based on intelligence information received from the FBI Organized Crime Task Force. Guilford officers participated in a multi-agency surveillance. Information gained from this surveillance resulted in the subject being arrested on federal charges and confessing to numerous burglaries in the New Haven County area *Reference Appendix B for graph representation*.

Criminal Mischief Cases:

Twenty-five (25) Criminal Mischief complaints were filed with the department period for the month of January. An examination of these incidents revealed the following details: eight, (8) incidents were to mailboxes, seven, (7) incidents were to private property, and ten, (10) incidents were to public or town property. It should be noted that eight of the (10) public/town property cases were as a result of damage to the skating rink on the town green. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. No suspect or vehicle information was received. *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation*.

Larceny Cases:

Fourteen (14) larceny complaints were filed. A detailed examination of these incidents revealed the following details. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation*.

Two sexual assault type cases were reported to the department. The subject is known by the victim in both cases. Both are active investigation.



Information and Intelligence received on criminal activity:


