Crime Analysis

A set of systematic, analytical processes directed at providing timely and pertinent information relative to crime patterns and trend correlations to assist the operational and administrative personnel in planning the deployment of resources for the prevention and suppression of criminal activities, aiding the investigative process, and increasing apprehensions and the clearance of cases. *During the month of March 2008. The Guilford Police Department had the following **Part 1** and selected **Part 2** Crimes reported: Reference Appendix A for further information.*

Burglary Cases

One commercial burglary was reported. The case was solved. No arrest made as the victim discovered a relative was responsible and did not wish the case pursued any further. There were no residential burglaries reported during this period. *Reference Appendix B for a graph representation.*

Criminal Mischief Cases:

Fourteen (14) criminal mischief cases were filed; Six were private property damage, six were public property, and two were mailbox damage. No similarities in cases were found. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. No suspect or vehicle information was received. *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation.*

Larceny Cases:

Thirteen (13) larceny complaints were filed. A detailed examination of these cases revealed the following details: Of the thirteen cases, five (5) of the cases were scrap metal thefts with three (3) of these occurring on the Boston Post Road. A business owner, whom had been a victim installed a cctv system and recorded one of the thefts from his business. Information gained from this along with interviews enabled officers to solve all (5) scrap thefts. In addition the subjects arrested have admitted to numerous thefts in towns surrounding Guilford. *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation.*

Murder Cases:

Rape Cases:

Three sexual assault type cases were reported. One case has been cleared and determined to be non-criminal. One case occurred several years ago and was reported by a mandated reporter from another state. The victim does not wish to provide any information or further details. In the one remaining case the subject is known by the victim. The case is under active investigation.

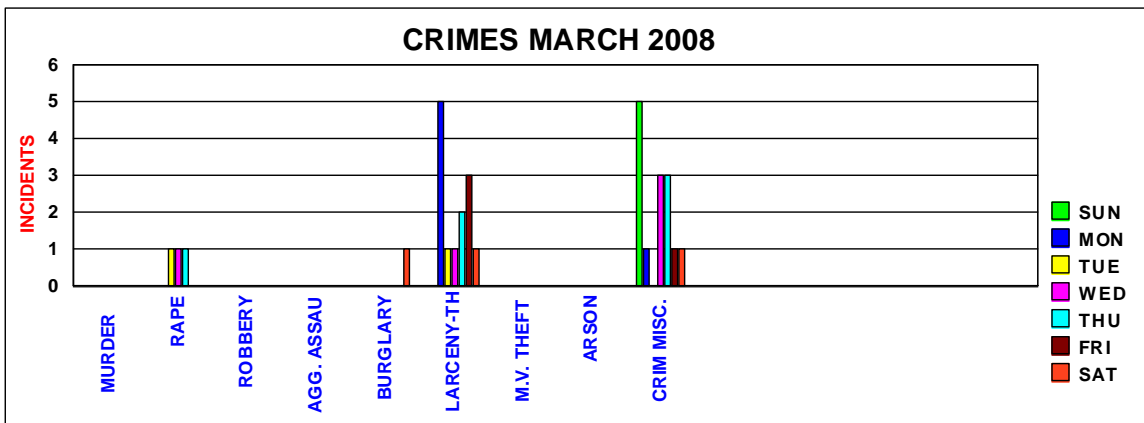

Information and Intelligence received on criminal activity:

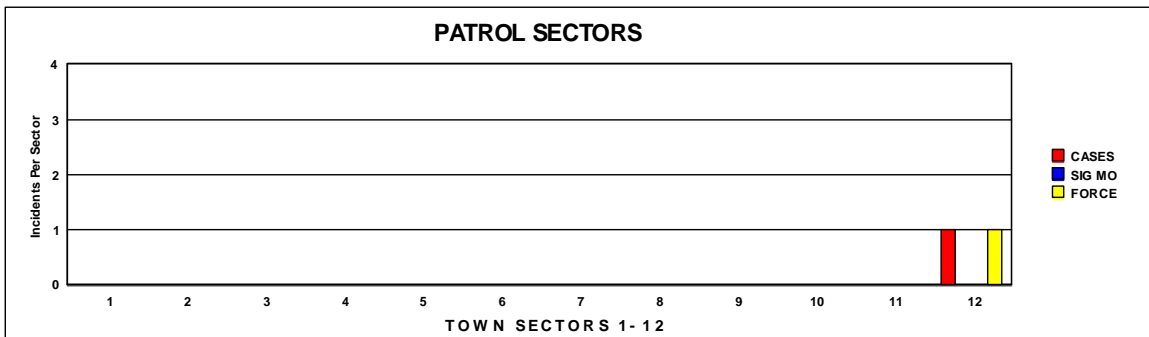
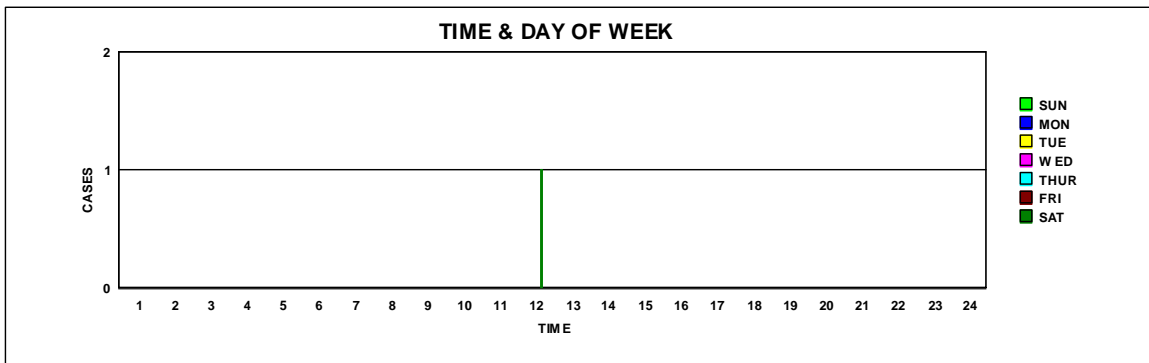
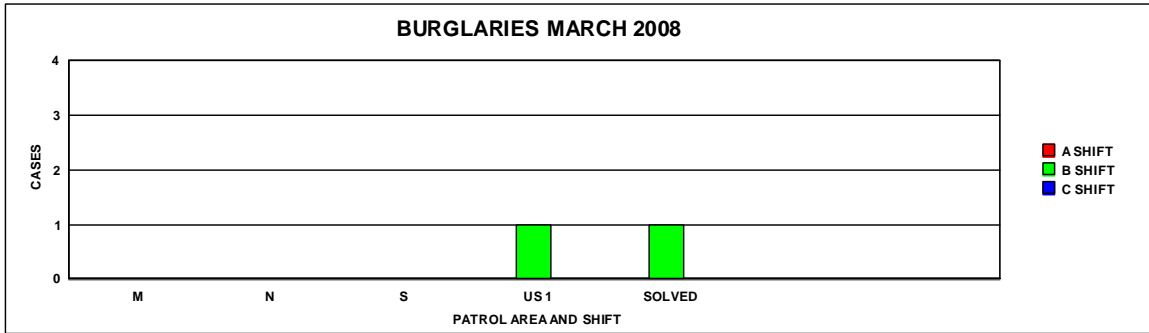
