Crime Analysis

A set of systematic, analytical processes directed at providing timely and pertinent information relative to crime patterns and trend correlations to assist the operational and administrative personnel in planning the deployment of resources for the prevention and suppression of criminal activities, aiding the investigative process, and increasing apprehensions and the clearance of cases. SUBJECT: Crime Analysis Report May 2008

During the month of May 2008. The Guilford Police Department had the following **Part** 1 and selected **Part** 2 Crimes reported: Reference Appendix A for further information.

Burglary Cases

There were a total of nine (9) burglaries reported during this period. Eight (8) residential and (1) commercial. Of these nine burglaries a total of five (5) were solved. Arrests are pending for one suspect in two of the solved cases. In two cases a distinct pattern and modes operandi was found. *Reference Appendix B for a graph representation*.

Criminal Mischief Cases:

Twenty-Five (25) criminal mischief cases were filed; Thirteen were private property damage, five were public property, four were mailbox damage, and three were damage to windows. Nine cases were solved with four resulting in arrests. The remaining solved cases were handled between the complainants and the subjects. No similarities in cases were found. There was no distinct patterns or modes operandi (MO) in any of these cases. . *Reference Appendix C for a graph representation*.

Larceny Cases:

Twenty-five (25) larceny complaints were filed. A detailed examination of these cases revealed the following details: Of the twenty-five cases, a total of eight larceny cases were solved with one resulting in an arrest. Three cases are currently pending arrests. The remaining four cases were handled between the complainant and the subjects. One of the larceny cases was re-classified as unfounded after the complainant located her missing property. In remaining cases no distinct patterns or modes operandi was found. *Reference Appendix D for a graph representation.*

Robbery Cases:

During this reporting period two armed robbery occurred within this jurisdiction. One (1) commercial, and (1) residential. Both cases were solved and arrests were made in both cases. One case involved the theft from a commercial storage business where the owner of the business was struck by the fleeing subject vehicle. The second case involved the complainant encountering two subjects at his home. Upon refusing to part with his property he was pistol whipped. In both cases the subjects fled the scene and were captured a short time later by the police. There was no distinct pattern or modus operandi, M.O. in these cases, both incidents were independent of each other.











Burglary cases for May 2008











Criminal Mischief cases for May 2008
